LEADERSHIP UPDATE

This Sunday marks the third Sunday of Advent when we continue our reflections in preparation for celebrating the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Traditionally we light candles to mark each Sunday of Advent that remind us that Jesus is the light of the world and guides us through our lives. The readings from this weekend reflect this in both the Old and New Testament:

Reading 1, Isaiah 48:17-19

"Thus says Yahweh, your redeemer, the Holy One of Israel: I am Yahweh your God and teach you for your own good, I lead you in the way you ought to go."

For us at Cardinal Wiseman, the third Sunday of Advent holds a particularly special meaning as it is traditionally known as 'Gaudete Sunday' which is of course the name of one of our school houses. Gaudete comes from the Latin word Gaudete ("Rejoice"), which is the first word of the introit of this day's mass.





PLG Update


A Christmas Retreat at Alton Castle

They had a wonderful, prayerful experience as well as a Christmas party and a visit from Santa.












Presenting the Applied Arts 'Artist of 2018'
