## CARDINAL WISEMAN HELPS BUILD BRIDGES WITH ART PROJECT

Ingenious Cardinal Wiseman pupils took part in a bridge-building challenge at Coventry Cathedral as part of an engineering and art project.

The six Year 11 pupils took part in the challenge with several other Coventry schools to create 'Amaranthine', a piece of art inspired by Leonardo da Vinci bridges – which are famous for their simplicity.

Supervised by the engineering firm involved in the construction of the new Coventry Cathedral, Arup, as well as artist Jasmine McInerney, the pupils created their own da Vinci bridge out of carpet rolls and metal fasteners, before being joined with bridges made by other schools with colourful fabric to finish off the artwork.

The event was organised by Coventry performance company Imagineer in the run up to its own project, 'Bridge', which saw a large bridge pop up in Broadgate and play host to a spectacular acrobatic performance.

Aisling McClelland, Head of Applied Arts, said: "On the day, the students had to work as a team to create their da Vinci bridge, and it was fantastic to see how well they communicated with each other to finish off their bridge. I'm very proud of the pupils for contributing to such an interesting piece of art, and I hope it inspires them to continue to be creative."

Dave Long of Imagineer, who invited Cardinal Wiseman to take part in the project, added: "The Cardinal Wiseman team showed real civic pride for Coventry by participating in this project – they should be very proud of creating a beautiful piece of public art like Amaranthine in such an iconic building."



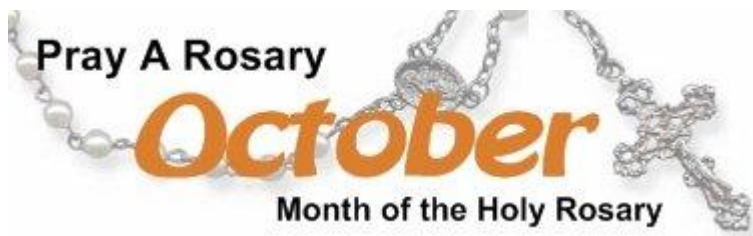
# Consultation on Admission arrangements for Cardinal Wiseman Catholic School for entry from September 2021

Admissions to Cardinal Wiseman will continue to be co-ordinated through Coventry LA's Co-ordinated Scheme. We are proposing to amend the course entry requirements to our Sixth Form. The consultation period will run from 7 October 2019 – 18 November 2019.

## Year 11

- All Year 11 should be using GCSEPod regularly to support and embed learning ready for the summer exams. This is a fantastic tool for revision and one that has a proven track record of having a positive impact on pupils' attainment. This morning all Year 11 had a talk in their morning briefing from a GCSEPod guru who took them through the new features of the webpage and reinforced how to use it to its full potential.
- After school revision classes are going well. It is compulsory that pupils attend if they have been targeted by their subject teacher. If you are unsure if your child is needed, please contact either the Head of Faculty or Mr Forinton, Head of Year 11.
- Careers interviews have now started and the initial feedback has been very positive from pupils and staff. Pupils receive a 30 minutes session with our excellent careers advisor in order to support with queries and questions about post 16

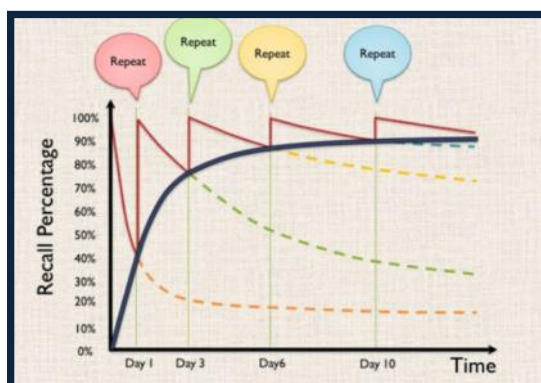

# Sixth Form Update

- This week, in Post-16 assembly, students were presented with information about meta-cognition - knowledge about your own understanding and thinking. We looked at the differences between long-term memory and short-term memory, and the most effective way of ensuring that what have you learned in your lessons will be processed into your long term memory so that you can recall it ready for exams. Students were introduced to a concept called the "Ebbinghaus Forgetting Curve" and a strategy to overcome this and use in revision called "Spaced Recall". Successful post-16 students perform best when they complete an additional 20-25 hours per week - so students should make the most of the independent study time available during the school day!



- Students in the sixth form have received their first email as part of our Healthy Minds Project - which will be running in school this year. They have been encouraged to try and achieve 9 targets per day

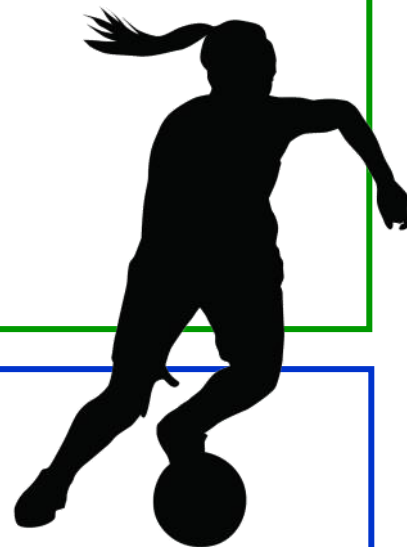
