Holiday Requests

Please may I remind you that our school policy makes it clear that we do not authorise term time holidays. Can I encourage you to plan any holidays around school breaks and not to take children out of school during term time. Every day your child attends school is very important.

Please remember if you proceed with an unauthorised holiday, the Local Authority may be informed and issue a Penalty Notice. This is currently £60 per parent per child, to be paid within 21 days (the fine doubles to £120 per parent per child after 21 days).

We do hope that you will continue to work in partnership with us.


Year 6 introduce ... PANTASTIC!
